What is a Comprehensive Community Plan?

A Comprehensive Community Plan (CCP) is a long-term, community-driven plan that is intended to guide CLFNs leadership and administration in making decisions for the Nation.

CLFNs' CCP will increase accountability, build member capacity, and enhance long-term sustainability for the Nation.

A CCP is an approach to community planning that brings CLFNs Members together to identify and prioritize areas for growth and development in the community. It is important that the community's vision, goals and actions are clearly laid out and endorsed by our Members. Equally important is that this plan is implemented, outcomes are regularly evaluated, and we revisit and update our plan annually.

- <u>Inspire the Community:</u> To work towards a common future vision.
- <u>Increase Efficiency:</u> Create a plan of action that utilizes all members in the community the best way possible.
- <u>Strengthen Administration:</u> Improve internal communications, improve management of staff and skill sets.
- <u>Map Future Development:</u> Use identified priorities to plan to address future community development and infrastructure needs.
- **<u>Preserve Resources:</u>** Identify and protect valuable traditions, areas, values and practices.
- <u>Celebrate Culture and Traditions</u>: Throughout the planning process, and through action items identified through the CCP.
- <u>Promote Reconciliation</u>: Address painful community issues together, by establishing a community vision and working towards achievement of this vision.
- <u>Create Economic Opportunities:</u> Identify economic opportunities to promote investment and growth in the region.
