the judges with a wide array of singing, jigging and fiddling. It was a tough competition but they have narrowed down the results. The winning contestants will have their performance broadcast during the evening of the event on July 10.

Canoe races, traditional games, bannock and tea making, all of the favourites will be taking place at the English Bay Treaty Grounds, followed by a traditional Tea Dance and for the first time in a long time, LIVE MUSIC!! Alex Kusturok and East To West will hit the stage later in the evening with their brand of upbeat fiddle driven country

rock. Get your dancing boots on!

After sunset the kids and hang out under the stars with an even bigger and brighter outdoor movie, and then after the credits be prepared for the largest fireworks display that CLFNS may of ever had. A special portion of the fireworks are being held in honour of the recently discovered residential school children.

This Treaty Days is going to be incredible, bring sun screen, water and if you choose, a mask. Bring the family down and celebrate! It's been a long time and we are all looking forward to it.

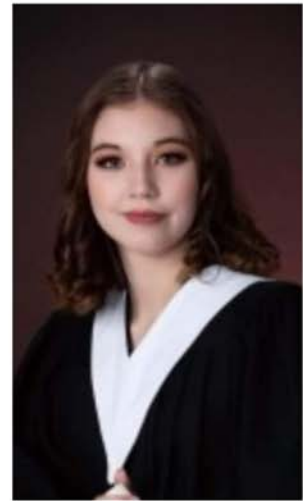



Once again, 4 Wing Military Police, Cold Lake RCMP, Cold Lake Peace Officers, and Victim Services are teaming up to serve the youth in the Cold Lake area with Positive Tickets. These Tickets will be given to kids who are caught being a community hero, demonstrating a positive attitude, making smart choices, or practicing personal safety. On top of looking cool, these tickets will result in the youth getting a reward. Rewards will be Slurpee's from 7 Eleven, ice cream cones from Dairy Queen or fries from McDonald's, with each positive ticket. Everyone that receives a ticket can also be entered into a draw for a prize. This year our prizes are an PS5, an iPad and Sports package worth \$250.00. To enter the draw, the recipient of the Positive Ticket must take a selfie with their ticket and post it on their (or a member of their family's) Facebook page and tag @ ColdLakeVictimServices.

In addition to the Positive ticket program, Cold Lake RCMP and Victim Services intend to do a community initiative in our two Indigenous communities of Elizabeth Metis Settlement and Cold Lake First Nations. We plan to team up with the schools of the two communities and do "Safety Presentations" to the students. At the completion of the presentation, the students will receive a positive ticket for their attendance/participation.
